



**Yeo Yat-Soon** studied at King's College London and the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, where he won the prestigious Raymond Russell Prize for Harpsichord. Yat-Soon has specialised in baroque opera and has conducted major productions for London Baroque Opera, the City of London Festival and Opéra de Baugé. Yat-Soon works widely as a harpsichordist, performing regularly at prestigious historic venues in the UK and throughout Europe. Recent solo work has included performances at Handel House Museum for the British Harpsichord Society and the Friedenau Kammersaal for the Early Music Society of Berlin. He is a member of Follia, The Lovekyn Consort and the Berlin-based Camerata

Berolinensis and has broadcast for BBC Radio 3 and Classic FM. Yat-Soon also has a long association with education, having been Director of Music at The Lady Eleanor Holles School and St Paul's Girls' School, during which time he conducted orchestras of national repute which toured China and the USA and broadcast for BBC and Channel 4 television.
